About Baxter

Baxter institute is a Christian educational institution in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, Central America. Itssole purpose is to prepare students to become preachers, teachers, missionaries, and leaders among the churches of Christ throughout the Spanish-speaking world.

Baxter offers five different courses of study that include various commitments:

- our one-year correspondence training program
- our three-year weekend training course (PEC)
- our four-year, university-level program
- our three, fifth-year programs: Marriage and Family Counseling, Strategic Church Growth, and Biblical Interpretation and Theology

Over the last 55 years, over 600 men and women have graduated from Baxter's four-year program and have gone out to spread the Gospel.

Serving like Christ

Currently, we have 66 students from 10 different countries: Ecuador, Colombia, Venezuela, Dominican Republic, Cuba, Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, and Nicaragua. These students come from many different backgrounds to take courses in Greek, Hebrew, English, Spanish, and computers in addition to their in-depth study of the Bible.

With a focus on evangelism, each weekend our students are assigned to a congregation in the area. They spend their Saturdays and Sundays going out to their assigned congregations to share the Good News of Jesus. During the 2018 school year, our students were instrumental in baptizing 145 people into

Christ. Our fourth-year students spend the first six months of their last year at Baxter in a full-time internship. They are assigned to work with a congregation in Central or South America.

These opportunities provide our students with a lot of hands-on training before they graduate and go throughout Latin America to preach and teach. They are truly living the Great Commission!

New at Baxter

This year at Baxter will be filled with wonderful opportunities for our students and exciting projects to improve our school and serve the people of Honduras. Dr. Evertt Huffard of Harding School of Theology came for a seminar with our students on the topic of "Following and Leading in the Kingdom of God." Mary Nelson came from New Zealand to lead a seminar on teaching children's Bible classes for our women and a seminar for another 192.

Every year, we are blessed to host and work with many groups from the United States coming to serve the Honduran people. We have already welcomed several groups coming on spring break brigades. The first two houses of the year have been built. We estimate 100 houses, costing \$1,500 each, will be built this year by these groups.

The first of three major projects in 2019 is under way. The renovation of the Frank Edward Price Memorial Chapel has begun. On December 1, 2017, we dedicated the chapel to deceased board member Frank Price for his service and his love for praising God. Enough funds were raised to begin the renovation, but additional donors are still needed. Do you want to help? You can buy a chair for the chapel that will be inscribed with your name.
